10 Overview and aims

This core Italian language module aims to build on the Italian language one modules, developing further fluency and accuracy in the spoken and written language. Grammar will be consolidated and essay-writing skills developed.

You will be introduced to a wider range of registers and varieties of the language, and will analyse written and audio-visual texts in more depth. For those students going abroad, there will be specific preparation, both practical and linguistic, by exploring areas of contemporary Italian society such as education and issues affecting young people. The module will also provide you with the opportunity to engage in professional skills through exposure to authentic or simulated employer brief. The opportunity to work on this work-like project will enable you to harness and activate the skills learned in year 1, as well as reflect upon your experience as part of a personal and career development plan.

11 Module content

The module focuses on developing both your understanding of key issues in contemporary Italian culture and society (typically including education, family, multiculturalism, the environment and current affairs), and your key communicative skills in Italian: listening, speaking, reading, writing. The module is therefore designed to reinforce your language learning and communication skills by encouraging you to engage with material in a range of media (written, electronic, audio-visual), consolidating your grammatical knowledge, and enabling you to participate actively in whole class, small group and paired discussions in Italian.

There will be a focussed block dedicated to a simulated work-like project. This will take the form of group activity, supervised by the module tutor, in which students work to a simulated employer's brief provided by the module team such as the translation of a website of a company, hotel, sports club or researching and producing an English–language summary of the coverage in the target-language press of an agreed current affairs topic.
