## 10 Overview and aims

You will select a topic of relevance to the Chinese subject (one that builds on previous study and relates to staff expertise) and conduct independent research on your chosen theme under the guidance of an academic supervisor. The module gives you the opportunity to explore in depth a linguistic, social, political or cultural issue or theme that is of personal and academic interest to you. By doing the capstone you will acquire various skills, such as research skills, self-reliance and planning and organisational skills. You must contact the module leader to agree the topic and the supervisor.

The aims of the module are:

- To build upon first and second year Chinese modules by allowing you to analyse a subject-related theme or issue in depth, drawing on relevant knowledge of the contemporary language, culture and society and on relevant theoretical positions
- To conduct a developed research project relating to an issue or theme with reference to language, politics, society and/or culture in the Chinesespeaking world.

To help develop the range of skills necessary to carry out a substantial piece of independent learning

#### 11 Module content

Research on and analysis of a Chinese-related subject/issue of your choice leading to

the submission of a dissertation and with certain key staging posts as follows:

- Selection of a topic and a suitable supervisor
- Discussion of a plan and a bibliography
- Discussion of reading and other research finding
- Discussion and amendment of draft chapters
