10 Overview and aims

This core Spanish language module aims to build on the Spanish language one module, developing further fluency and accuracy in the spoken and written language. It further develops the four language learning skills and other transferable skills, through such tasks as video analysis, summaries and translations, and oral debates and presentations. The module will be organised around the discussion of issues in contemporary Spain. For those of you going abroad, there will be preparation, both practical and linguistic, for extended residence in Spain. This module also aims to provide students with the opportunity to engage in professional skills through exposure to simulated work-like projects within the Spanish-speaking world. The opportunities offered to students to actively engage in work-like projects will enable them to reflect upon their experience within work-like simulated scenarios as an important point to keep on building their career development.

The second half-year, spent abroad, will consist of supervised oral and written tasks which will be assembled into a folder submitted for assessment at NTU.

11 Module content

The module focuses on developing both students' understanding of key issues in contemporary Spanish culture and society and your key communicative skills in Spanish: listening, speaking, reading, writing. The module is therefore designed to reinforce students' language learning and communication skills by encouraging them to engage with material in a range of media (written, electronic, audio-visual), consolidating their grammatical knowledge, and enabling them to participate actively in whole class, small group and paired discussions in Spanish. There will be a focussed block dedicated to a simulated work-like project. This will take the form of group activity, supervised by the module tutor, in which students work to a simulated employer's brief provided by the module team such as the translation of a website of a company, hotel, sports club or researching and producing an English-language summary of the coverage in the target-language press of an agreed current affairs topic.
